PRIA 4 Update

- An amendment to H.R. 1029 passed in the Senate on June 28, 2018;
- The amendment reauthorizes PRIA for 5 years, starting October 1, 2018, and running through September 30, 2023;
- The amended bill now goes back to the House of Representatives to be reconciled with the original bill passed on March 20, 2017.



Previous Stakeholder Meeting Follow-up – CATSAC

- Standard Evaluation Procedure (SEP) development continues;
 - purpose is to give guidance on both product chemistry and acute toxicity evaluation process;
 - provide common definitions and terminology such as 100% repack, identical products, substantially similar products, and potential for bridging data;
- Proposed PRIA 4 Category;
 - MO10 211: Conditional ruling on pre-application, product substantial similarity, 4 months, \$2,363




Previous Stakeholder Meeting Follow-up (cont'd) – Notifications PR Notice

- Status of Updated PRN on Notifications
 - Announcement of Updated PRN comments received and being reviewed by EPA
 - Range of comments include:
 - Objection to elimination of ability to add via notification
 - Additional sources of a.i.
 - Suppliers of inert ingredients
 - Changes to inert ingredient nominal concentration, certified limits
 - Inert ingredient disclosure statement
 - Fragrances/dyes
 - Terminology clarifications (e.g., public health pest)
 - Symbols, logos, graphics;
 - EPA is developing its response to comments.

FY'18 Non-PRIA Fast-Track Amendments & Notifications

- Through June, 2018, AD completed 462 non-PRIA fast track amendments and has 250 non-PRIA fast-track amendments pending, 112 of which are in backlog status (pending > 90 days). AD completed 842 notifications through June; 291 are pending, of which 251 are in backlog status (pending > 30 days);
- Through June, 2018, BPPD completed 151 non-PRIA fast track amendments and has 111 non-PRIA fast-track amendments pending, 70 of which are in backlog status. BPPD completed 163 notifications through June; 86 are pending, of which 74 are in backlog status;
- Through June, 2018, RD completed 839 non-PRIA fast track amendments and has 811 non-PRIA fast-track amendments pending, 622 of which are in backlog status. RD completed 814 notifications through June; 352 are pending, of which 298 are in backlog status.

FY'18 through June 2018: Electronic Label Reviews

- Tracking the use of electronic comparison software in conducting label reviews requires input from reviewers;
- Lack of necessary input increases uncertainty;
- % of labels reviewed electronically in RD: 87% 92%;
- % of labels reviewed electronically in AD: 90% 95%;
- % of labels reviewed electronically in BPPD: 58% 89%.






Actions That Have Completed the Screen







FY'18 through June 2018 : Reasons for 45/90 Screen Rejections/Withdrawals

- □ Data deficiencies/ Missing data, rationale, or waiver request
- ☐ Uncleared inerts/ missing inert data
- ☐ Inert ingredient misidentified
- □ Data matrix/data compensation issues
- ☐ Not substantially similar (both label and formulation)
- ☐ Inadequate efficacy data to support claims
- ☐ Citing studies relating to a different a.i.
- ☐ Bridging argument unacceptable
